The **birds-of-paradise** are members of the family **Paradisaeidae** of the order **Passeriformes**. The majority of species are found in eastern **Indonesia**, **Papua New Guinea**, and eastern **Australia**. The family has 42 species in 15 **genera**.<sup>[1]</sup> The members of this family are perhaps best known for the **plumage** of the males of the **sexually dimorphic** species (the majority), in particular the highly elongated and elaborate feathers extending from the beak, wings, tail or head. For the most part they are confined to dense **rainforest** habitat. The diet of all species is dominated by fruit and to a lesser extent arthropods. The birds-of-paradise have a variety of breeding systems, ranging from **monogamy** to **lek**-type **polygamy**.





These birds are beautiful and have very interesting nestling habits too.
